PERSONAL

I have been practicing Buddhist, Hindu, Daoist and other forms of meditation and yoga for over five decades, and teaching them in the college and the larger community since the 1990s. My primary research is in the philosophy of meditation, which while ancient in Asian philosophy is relatively hidden or novel in Western philosophy, with special emphasis on its self-cultivating, empowering, and transformative potentials, and to bring this contemplative form of “philosophy to the people”, in various forms of practical philosophy, such as philosophical counseling, consulting, coaching, and therapy.

For over 50 years, I have engaged in an ecology of self-transformational and related spiritual, sapiential practices: various forms of meditation, yoga, mindful running, martial arts (4th degree black belt in Shotokan karate), chanting, prayer, journaling, fasting, and related contemplative practices, all of which play a central role in my understanding and living of philosophy as a way

of life.

I've been leading a weekly meditation group for the college community since 2007, which for several years met in person on campus, but which shifted to Zoom during the pandemic and has remained online since.

I have also been leading a weekly meditation and dialogue group for the Vervaeke Foundation since early 2023, which meets for a roughly 45 minute meditation followed by a roughly two-hour dialogue on all things meditative.

I'm a former Fellow of the Center for Contemplative Mind in Society, and a co-founder of the CUNY Mindfulness and Contemplative Studies initiative (CMCS), formerly the CUNY Contemplatives Network, which latter began in 2006 with support from a grant from the Fetzer Institute, the American Council of Learned Societies, and the Center for Contemplative Mind in Society. I'll be teaching in a graduate level Mindfulness Teacher Training Certification program at Lehman College, CUNY, starting in Fall 2025, which I helped the CMCS develop.

I'm also a VP / Board Member of the American Philosophical Practitioners Association (APPA), APPA faculty member, co-chair of the APPA Board of Examiners, and APPA-certified philosophical counselor, with clients all over the world. I also supervise two groups of philosophical counselors: Socratic Counseling LLC and the Philosophical Counselors Working Group.
